When will those two vacancies be filled if they are ever going to be?

No. 11. By the Honourable Mr. Domville:—

November 26—That an humble Address be presented to His Excellency the Governor General; praying that His Excellency will cause a Return to be laid before the Senate of all correspondence with the Government or any of its departments in respect to the Imperial regiment known as the King's Colonials.
