My dear General:-I intended had I had a few minutes longer with you the other day to explain that the invitation to Sir Arthur to attend the meeting of the British Empire Service League in Ottawa did not arrive until the 25th of June, the day before he was leaving for England, so that he could not even reply to it personally. I am sure that you will understand it was no lack of courtesy towards the Association of which you have been self-sacrificing enough to become President that prevented him from expressing at least his goodwill, as I know he would have done had he received the letter. I shall tell him when I write of the talk I had with you and I am quite sure he will feel that the G.W.V.A. is under a guide who will do his best to bring about the union which we would all like to see.
