And as David returned from the slaughter of the Philistine Abner took him and brought him before Saul with the Head of the Philistine in his hand. 1Sam. 17 Chap.




DAVID danceth before the ARK.

A BEAUTIFUL AND ACCURATE ELEVATION OF THE TEMPLE OF SOLOMON TAKEN FROM THE CELEBRATED MODEL ERECTED BY COUNSELLOR S Ornamented with the most interesting Passages in the Lives of King David and Solomon his Son.



This Structure for Beauty, Magnificence and Expense, exceeded every Building in the World. It was Built with large white Marble Stones, hewn out in most curious manner; and skilfully joined together that they deserved the Eye and looked like one entire stone. Inner Walls, Beams, Posts, Beams, Floors and Ceilings were made of Cedar wood, Olive tree, and Planks of Fir, covered all over with Plates of Gold. Engraved with works of various sorts and adorned





with most precious jewels of many colours, disposed in a running order, the Vials which fastened these Plates were of gold with heads of curious workmanship. The Roof was of Olive wood covered with plates of gold, which made a glorious sight and when the sun shone thereon, it reflected such a brightness as dazzled the Eyes of all who beheld it. The Court in which the Temple stood and those without it were built on all sides with stately Buildings and cloisters, and the gates entering

therin were very Beautiful and Sumptuous. The Vessels consecrated to the perpetual use of the Temple were not less noble than the Pyle itself. Josephus counts one hundred and forty thousand of them which were made of gold, and one million three hundred and forty thousand of Silver; ten Thousand Vestments of silk with Purple borders for the Priests, and two Millions of Purple Vestments for singers. There were likewise two hundred Thousand Trumpets, and forty Thousand other Musical Instruments

made use of in Praising God by Villipandus's computation of the Number of Talents of Gold, Silver, & Brass laid out upon the Temple, the sum amounts to six Thousand 9 Hundred and 4 Millions 8 Hundred & 23 Thousand, and hundred Pounds Sterling & the Jewels are reckoned to exceed this sum & according to Capels reduction of the Talents contained in the Gold & silver Vessels in the Use of the Temple, the sum of the Gold ones, amounts to six hundred & 65 Millions 2 hundred & 90 Thousand 2 hundred & 31 Pounds

41 Shillings Sterling, and the Silver come to Eight hundred & 39 Millions 1 hundred & 4 thousand & 9 hundred & 6 pounds & besides these, there were charges for the other Materials, & of 10 Thousand Pounds of Lebanon to her down timber, 70 Thousand teavary Barbers, 90 Thousand to her Stones, and 17 Thousand 1 hundred Overseers who were all employed for 3 Years to whom besides their Wages & Diet, Solomon gave, as a fine gift, 6 Millions 1 hundred and 33 Thousand 9 hundred and 73 Pounds. THE SANCTUARY or Holy of Holies with 1 Kings 6. 19. 23.

The Holy of Holies was a room 30 feet Square and 30 feet High the Beam & Rafter of which was very great, the ceiling was paved with gold, and the walls were all made of Walls Planished and deck'd with Cherubims and Palm Trees with precious stones in them.
