## Preparing to Install The Mutuels at Dorval

MONTREAL, Nov. 13.—Manager Sam Holman of the Dorval Jockey Club returned to Montreal yesterday afternoon from a trip around the southern race tracks, rounding up nominations for the International Derby of a guaranteed value of \$20,000 to be run again at Dorval next June.

Mr. Holman expresses himself as well pleased with the results of his trip, which, however, was somewhat curtailed thru the death in Kentucky, of his only sister.

Prospects for the Derby are considered satisfactory taking into consideration existing conditions, and it is anticipated that a good field of horses will go to the post for the big annual event in Montreal.

While he was away, Mr. Holman has examined carefully the mutual system in use at Laurel and Latonia tracks with a view to the installing of the mutuels at Dorval next year.
