60 Women and Children in First Boat Launched Were Lost

Few of Liner's Boats Launched

Three operators strove desperately to keep abreast of the ever-growing stream of messages. In Four Morgues. In four morgues lay the dead, women in some cases side by side with children. The body of Charles Frohman, the theatrical manager, was placed in a face upward in a bath room in an old building on the hillside, a hundred yards from the water's edge. Around him were ranged fifty bodies of both sexes, over which attendants were bending, sorting and ticking their belongings. Those men best fitted to chronicle the last moments of the Lusitania, Herbert Hubbard, Justus Miles, Forster, Charles Frohman, Alfred Gwynne Vanderbilt and others apparently all went to their graves with her.
