

Evening.—Illumination of grounds and buildings till 10 o'clock. At 7 o'clock great entertainment in front of grand stand same as on previous evenings, introducing all the special features, and the wonderful naval-military-pyrotechnical spectacle the Bombardment and Destruction of the Taku Forts by the Allied fleets, real miniature man-of-war actually moving and working on real water, blowing up and sinking of the Chinese fleet, magnificent fireworks, aquatic and aerial. Concerts during the evening by the several bands.

Friday, Sept. 6th

Stock Breeders' and Grand Parade Day.—The last, but by no means the least important day of Canada's Great Exposition for 1901. Everything will remain intact the whole day and all the special features of other days will be repeated, in addition to which there will be a grand parade of all the prize horses and cattle past the grand stand at 2 o'clock in the afternoon, affording one of greatest and most interesting sights of the exposition. A procession over two miles in length of the finest of horses and cattle in the country, a sight worth travelling many miles to see. The entertainment by the great company of specialty artists on the immense stage, running horse races, in cedars' stake 1 mile and 200 yards, and half-bred race 1 mile and 200 yards. Special military displays and firing of explosive shells by the Royal Canadian Field Artillery and machine guns, interesting features by the Royal Canadian Dragoons, etc. Music by the 12th York Milit., the Neapolitan Troubadours and Exposition bands.

Evening.—Illumination of grounds and buildings, and all departments open till 10 o'clock. All the special features, and entertainment in front of grand stand, band concerts, etc.

Saturday, Sept. 7th.

Exhibitors' Day Only.—The public not admitted. The Exhibition will be considered officially closed at 7 a.m., after which exhibitors may remove their exhibits. The Treasurer will be ready to pay prizes at 9 a.m., and all who can make it convenient to do so are requested to call for their awards before leaving the grounds.
