out in parliament, I have taken the liberty to address to you some Letters upon the American war. You will receive them in print soon after the receipt of this. I hope and trust in the favourable opinion of my constituents to believe me, when I assure them, that it always has been, and ever will be, my sincere intention to execute the trust which they have reposed in me, according to the best of my abilities, with industry, vigilance and sidelity.
