Troops for the Front Detained There.

Expected Attack on that City.

MONTREAL, June 3—2 o'clock, p. m.

The Fusiliers arrived, but were detained here.

The 25th regiment was ordered back from the depot when on the eve of starting. It is believed that an attack is contemplated on Montreal.

The Royal Guides and two troops of cavalry go to the Eastern Township to-morrow morning.

The inspection of all the troops in garrison is now going on on Champ de Mars.

Anticipated attack on the Canal.

KINGSTON, June 3.

The 14th Battalion have been under arms since Friday night, ready and eager to be sent to the front. At 8 p.m. they marched in a body to St. George's Cathedral, where an appropriate sermon was preached by the Rev. S. B. Windsor, Chaplain to the forces. Just as the battalion was leaving the Cathedral the order to move arrived.

The men were at once formed on the market place in Hollow Square, when the order to proceed without a moment's delay to Cornwall, was read to them by Lieut.-Colonel Paton and received with eager enthusiasm and tremendous cheering.

The scene was one of intense excitement, the citizens participating in the loyal emanation of the men.

The battalion started this evening by special train for Cornwall. An attack on the canal being apprehended. A crowded meeting of the citizens was held in the city Hall this afternoon, the Mayor in the chair. Measures were proposed and adopted for preserving the peace of the city. Just before the meeting broke up it was announced that Lt. Col. Paton had received orders for the fourteenth to proceed without delay to Cornwall, which intimation caused much excitement.

Resolutions were moved by the leading citizens of Kingston and unanimously adopted that the loyal old city of Kingston would take good care of and provide for the families of her gallant volunteers, while they are engaged in the defence of their country against foreign invaders.

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
