ST. BASS BEATS DENHAM CAPER SAUCE IS THIRD Only Two Favorites Win on Third Day and Books Keep the Money - Results at Louisville. HAMILTON, June 20.-Fair weather and a good attendance favored the Hamilton Jockey Club for the third day. Eight races were again on the program, with the Dominion Plate for three-year-olds upwards foaled in Canada, at one and an eighth miles, as the feature of the day. App the King's Plate winner, St. Bass, turned the tables on Denham, who beat him on Saturday. Speculation was brisk on this race, with Denham heavily backed at 7 to 5. Form favorites looked for the Valley Farm gelding to repeat his good race of Saturday over St. Bass, but he found the latter a more powerful opponent. The field got away well to a good break, with Denham out in front setting the pace three lengths in front of St. Bass and Caper Sauce. They ran in this order to the top turn, where St. Bass moved up on even terms and after a hard drive to the stretch St. Bass drew away to win easily by three lengths. Caper Sauce ran his usual honest race and was back up at the wire. Only two favorites got the eye of the judges out of the eight races, and the layers had much the better of the day with the players. The Gibson Handicap furnished a good contest. The winner turned up in Lawton Wiggins, who repeated T. G. Butty's feat Saturday, when he made Novelty stretch his neck to beat him at three-quarters. In this race The Nigger, who won the Toronto Cup, was heavily backed to win, but after getting off well died away in the run home finishing in Denham, who was the favorite. The winner ran the seven-eighths in 1:21.4, only one-fifth of a second behind the track record. Handicappers look the steepchase from Judge Cronin and Day after a close and exciting race thru the field.
