INFORMATION ON INDUSTRIAL COMPANIES.

World Office, Thursday Evening, Aug. 9.

The recent assertion that the Nova Scotia Steel Company will make \$200,000 more this year than last, brings uppermost again the necessity for more frequent official reports than are now given out by Canadian industrial concerns. Earnings weekly or monthly, as provided by the railroads and tractions, are out of the question, but the immense United States Steel Trust finds it convenient and judicious to issue a quarterly statement, and, with this as a precedent, no reasonable argument can be advanced against the same course by Canadian industrials with shares listed on the exchange, or otherwise. Such a course would necessarily limit the field for manipulation of the stock quotations, but it would tend to provide a better investment demand than now evidently exists for these stocks. Shareholders, whether speculative or otherwise, are permitted only on sufferance to learn anything regarding their company except at the annual meeting. Confiding the entire knowledge of sharp changes in a company's business for a period of several months with a few individuals, provides good stock market information for a select coterie, but is not fair treatment of the less favored shareholder. The refusal on the part of investors to participate in any industrial company that does not provide up-to-date information of its progress or retrogression will soon bring about a change.
