TRICKS HELP WRESTLER TO ESCAPE A POLICEMAN

Norman Chrysler, Arrested on a Charge of Theft, Twists Free and Slips Away in Crowd.

Hamilton, March 24.—(Special.)—Norman Chrysler, the wrestler, was arrested at James and Rebecca-streets on the charge of theft last night. Policeman Tuck took the wrestler by the arm and the prisoner walked meekly and quietly along with him until they reached the city hall steps. There the wrestler, using one of his tricks, gave a lunge and twisted free. Tuck grabbed him by the coat-tail, but the garment ripped up the back and Chrysler was soon lost in the crowd.

George Wilkerson, an employee of the Hamilton Steel & Iron Co., was crushed to death between an immense electric crane and a post to-day. He was 26 years of age and unmarried. Coroner Rennie will hold an inquest to-morrow morning.

FLOOD TIES UP CALIFORNIA.
Heavy Rains Stop Railroad and Telegraph Communication.

San Francisco, March 24.—Following a severe rainstorm, railroad and telegraph communication is almost entirely suspended over the greater part of California. The rivers in the interior valleys are rising, and the area of the flood region is rapidly extending.

The railroad blockade is almost complete. No regular trains are running into or out of San Francisco. The mail carriers, F. Griend and T. Dasonville, were delayed near Fair Oaks yesterday by the capsizing of a boat.

SIMPLIFIED SPELLING BOARD
First Annual Meeting to be Held in New York April 3.

New York, March 24.—William F. Maclean, editor of The Toronto World, and Alexander H. MacKay, superintendent of education of Nova Scotia, will represent the Dominion of Canada at the first annual meeting of the simplified spelling board, to be held in the Waldorf-Astoria Hotel, New York, on April 3 and 4. Both Mr. MacKay and Mr. Maclean will read papers at the meeting.

The occasion will be a great gathering of philologists and scholars. Among the representatives of Great Britain are William Archer. The meeting will consist of business sessions, discussions of papers, and a dinner, at which Andrew Carnegie will preside.

O'BRIEN Buries Hatchet
And Will Stay Away From Parliament to Avoid Trouble.

London, March 23.—William O'Brien, Nationalist member of the house of commons for Cork, has announced his intention of absconding himself from the present session of parliament in order to avoid further friction with the Irish party, which has now virtually accepted the government's proposals for Irish legislation. Thus there is no longer any serious divergence. Mr. O'Brien explains, between himself and the party. It is understood further that Mr. O'Brien and his friends have decided to drop all pending litigation with the followers of John E. Redmond.

BATTLESHIP IN COLLISION.
Weymouth, Eng., March 23.—A collision occurred to-day off Portland between the British battleship Africa and the Peninsular and Oriental Line steamer Ormuz, bound for Australia. Both vessels sustained slight damages.

THAW DENIES HIS LEGAL STAFF HAS FOUGHT AGAIN

Evelyn Nesbit Permitted to Visit Husband for the First Time on a Sunday.

New York, March 24.—Harry K. Thaw to-night made public another statement, this time denying a rumor, widely spreading, that he is currently taking a dismission among his counsel. He also refers to the affidavits filed with Justice Fitzgerald by his attorneys, opposing the appointment of a lunacy commission to examine him.

The monotony of Thaw's Sunday at the Tombs was broken by an unexpected visit from his wife. This was the first time since his detention that the prisoner was allowed to receive callers other than his counsel on Sunday.

Mrs. Thaw had come to the Tombs with a message for her husband, and was agreeably surprised when told that she might visit him. The two were together for a half hour, and when Mrs. Thaw left she said:

"Harry is in excellent health, and is sure everything will come out in his favor."
During the afternoon, when he devoted chiefly to correspondence, Thaw received a note from Lawyer Daniel O'Reilly, explaining that none of the affidavits to the court that day, and that Mr. Hartridge and the writer were busily engaged in preparing affidavits to be presented to Justice Fitzgerald to-morrow.
