

## THINKS BORDEN WILL BE BEATEN

Hon. Geo. P. Graham Argues That Quebec Elections Fore-shadow Defeat of Federal Government.

"The result of the Quebec elections shows that if Premier Borden is to go to the country now he would meet sure defeat," said Hon. George P. Graham, M.P., former minister of railways, in an interview at the Prince George. Mr. Graham went on to say that the Quebec election was a great triumph for the Liberals, and went to show that the people were losing confidence in the Borden government. It showed strongly that the Nationalists were no longer in favor of Borden and fore-shadowed his defeat at the next general election.

Referring to the statement recently appearing in The Toronto Globe to the effect that he would probably be the next president of the Grand Trunk Railway, Mr. Graham said there was absolutely no truth in the report, that, in fact, he had never been approached on the subject.

## BLACK PAINT ONLY HELPED HIS ELECTION

MONTREAL, May 18.—(Special).—While discussing the result in St. Louis division, the member-elect, Godfrey Langlois, says that, although it was not a party contest, St. Louis dominated the province, as all eyes were on that division. The best men of all parties, creeds and races, added Mr. Langlois, united to crush those who, covering themselves by the mantle of religion, attempted to stay the march of educational reform in Quebec.

The electorate, added the member-elect, declined to listen to the unfortunate appeals of Rev. Father Belanger, who, from his pulpit of St. Louis de France, as well as the Jewish candidate, wanted a man of one race elected. Mr. Langlois says that his election was a crushing rejoinder to a certain press which has represented him during the last ten years as an incarnation of Satan himself, even if he has tried to live like a good citizen and to treat every man alike, irrespective of his race or religion.

## Seven Years For Thorogood

Sentenced by Mr. Justice Latchford for Killing of Joseph Sabino in Pool Room Brawl.

Walter Thorogood, who was found guilty of manslaughter, was Saturday morning sentenced by Mr. Justice Latchford to seven years in the penitentiary. The crime was committed in a pool-room brawl on West Queen-street, when Thorogood struck Joseph Sabino with a billiard cue. Sabino afterwards died in the hospital. At his first trial the jury disagreed, and it came, therefore, rather as a surprise when the second jury found him guilty of manslaughter.

## ALCOHOL FOR PITTSBURG.

A contract with the Pittsburgh municipal authorities for three Alco trucks of 6½ tons rating is announced by the American Locomotive Company. The vehicles will be used for hauling asphalt, a work that at present involves a saving to the city of \$15,000 a year over horses.

It became a question with the authorities this year of adding to their equipment of seven teams or supplanting the animals with motors. The matter has been agitated in Pittsburgh for some time and an investigation showed that the machines could do the work more efficiently while proving an economy.

The trucks will be equipped with bodies to facilitate quick loading and dumping of asphalt. Each truck will carry sufficient material at a load for two square yards of street surface.

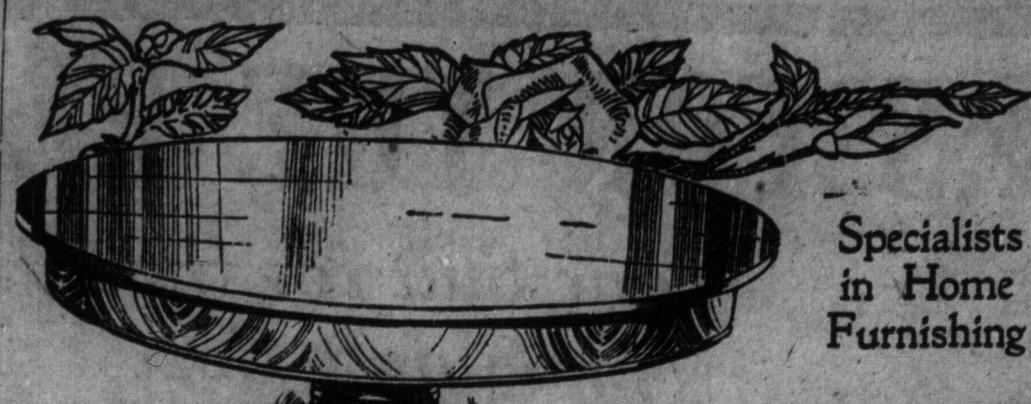
## Where Are You Going Victoria Day?
