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brought forth kind helps from some who could only do a little, but did that little gladly and promptly.

The harvest is still great, the labourers are still few, and the Master still calls on us saying, "Pray ye," knowing that if we pray truly, we will also work earnestly. Eight such meetings have been held; they are discontinued during the summer months.

We have had two addresses: one from the Bishop of Saskatchewan and one from Mrs. Osborne a lady who has worked as a missionary in India for years. Both were stirring appeals from those who had themselves seen the need they called upon us to aid.

The average attendance at our meetings has been 24. We have collected \$640.00; this sum has been divided between the Indians in the Diocese of Saskatchewan, the Beaconsfield mission in the Diocese of Rupertsland, Algoma, and the Zenana mission. A box of clothing was also sent to Mrs. Bourne for the Indians, for which she returned most grateful thanks.
