Ludendorff denied reports of dissension between the emperor and the Crown Prince. He said the Crown Prince often spoke of peace by an understanding. Ludendorff expressed a willingness that his actions should be tried before any unprejudiced man of common sense.

from Berlin quotes an interview with General Ludendorff, former first quartermaster-general of the German army, MORNING NEWS

in which Ludendorff repeats former statements that he desired peace on the basis of the status quo, both in 1917 and

Ludendorff is reported to have said that the events in August of last year showed that the value of some units in the German army had depreciated and that an improvement was not to be expected in view of the fact that the war had broken the will of the people at home. Afterwards the ground had become shaky, said Ludendorff, and he informed the government that it was no longer possible to make Germany's enemies desire peace by means of war, and that the warfare should be ended quickly.


