## ARE KILLING CHRISTIANS.

Turkish Barbarities Witnessed at by  
German Officers.

Petrograd, Dec. 17.—It is reported by  
an Armenian who has escaped from  
Erzerum that 20,000 Christians there are  
suffering every outrage at the hands of  
the Turks under German command. The  
town contains 80,000 Turkish soldiers,  
1,500 officers, and an enormous amount  
of stores and munitions, and the Ger-  
mans are complete masters both of the  
town and the fortress.  
The Turk threatened to massacre all  
Christians on account of the sympathies  
of the latter for the Russians. The  
prisoners are overworked with Armenians  
and Greeks accused of espionage, and  
executions are a daily occurrence.  
Christians are simply hanged to the  
nearest lamp-post, and their bodies are  
left swinging for days. Turks spit upon  
and otherwise mock the dead.

## MORE HIGHLANDERS FOR THE WAR SERVICE

Fifth Royals Will Recruit Second Bat-  
talion to Send to Front.

Montreal, Dec. 17.—Another battalion  
of Highlanders will go from Montreal  
with the third Canadian expeditionary  
force. This will constitute a second ac-  
tive service battalion for the 5th Royal  
Highlanders, which will be commanded  
by Lt.-Col. G. S. Canlie, with Major  
Leonard as second in command. This  
will be the only infantry battalion call-  
ed from Montreal for the third contin-  
ent, and it will go from there in kilts,  
with about 1,100 men.

## THE DUKE OF ARGYLL LEFT A BIG ESTATE

Probate Shows It Amounting to More  
Than Three Million Dollars.

London, Dec. 17.—Probate of the will  
of the late Duke of Argyll, former  
Governor-General of Canada, shows es-  
tate in his own disposition to have  
amounted to more than \$3,000,000, of  
which \$1,835,320 was personal.

In addition, it is said he was a life  
tenant of settled property of very con-  
siderable value.
