

ADDRESS BY THE SESSION.

The Session, as the Congregation will readily understand, are not in a position to give anything this year like a Sessional report. REPORT OF DEACONS' COURT.

In submitting the Annual Report of the Deacons' Court this year, it is with the deepest sorrow at the removal by death of our Chairman, the late Pastor of the Congregation, the Rev. James Cameron, who for so long a period worked on the most harmonious terms with us, always giving us the benefit of his wise counsel and earnest advice, and whose labours as Chairman of the Court, as well as the example he left us, should not fail to be of the greatest service to us in the discharge of our duties in the future, and that his name and his labors amongst us would always be remembered with affection. We would also express our deep sympathy with the widow and family of our deceased Pastor, in their severe bereavement. In referring to the finances of the Church, it is with pleasure we have to report that during the year an effort was made successfully to pay off the debt against the Church, amounting to \$188.00, so that we are enabled to say at the present time there are no liabilities against us, while a surplus remains in the hands of the Treasurer to the amount of \$76.00.
