All parties who intend putting up what is known as "Scotch Pack" must have the standard barrels. Contents, 26 2/3 Imperial gallons. Barrels to be firm and well made with knots all putted, wind and water tight. Kind contents by 23 inch diagonal rod from crown to crown—this is the proper size.

This barrel can only be made with steel trusses and cleated with pluckers, square stave and square point.

Trusses and tools may be imported through the Marine and Fisheries Department on receipt of application from those who desire to have the same. The charge will be cost price nett.

Obituary

There passed peacefully away on August 3rd, Mary Jane Neil, wife of Capt. Richard Neil, of Spaniard's Bay, at the age of 64 years. The deceased lady was one of our most respected and beloved citizens. Being of a quiet and unassuming disposition she endeared herself to all she came in contact with, and her demise is greatly deplored by inhabitants of this and adjacent settlements. Up to a year or two ago she possessed the best of health—being of splendid physique, and cheery countenance. She had two sons, Ralph and Edward, in the R. N. R., who, when the war began, were at the Labrador, and were called home to report on board H. M. S. "Calypto," but their services not then being required they were granted leave until their services were required. Ralph shipped on board the schooner Antoinette, Capt. Webber, which was lost with all hands somewhere in the Mediterranean about November 22, 1915.

The blow was so great to the fond mother that she never recovered from its effects, and although everything possible was done for her, she gradually sank away until death relieved her of her suffering on the above date. She was laid to rest in the C. of E. Cemetery. Her son Edward is still serving his King and Country on one of His Majesty's Ships somewhere in the North Sea, and on many occasions has shown his ability and daring as a British sailor.

Mrs. Neil leaves a husband, five sons and one daughter, for whom much sympathy is felt.—COM.
