—Spokane mail clerks have been proving themselves on a speedy sorting of mail cards for the elimination of the war there, but it now appears that the work done does not compare with that of the British Columbia railway mail clerks. The Spokane record gives 507 cards distributed without error (one instance only), in 35.36 minutes. At the recent examination held by J. O. MacLeod, superintendent railway mail service, the record was 19.5 minutes for 918 cards thrown without error.
