ASPIRIN" BARRED

Ottawa, — Collectors of National Revenue have been notified by departmental headquarters here that goods imported for sale bearing the word or trade mark "Aspirin" are prohibited importation into Canada. It is explained that the prohibition results from the Court decision under which one firm was granted the right to use the word or trade mark "Aspirin" on its product when sold in Canada. In order to insure that products which are not entitled to use this trade mark, according to the decision of the courts, do not get into the Canadian marked from abroad, it has been decided to prohibit their entry.
