New York, Aug. 14-A Berne, Switzerland, despatch to the Journal

"That the Austro-Hungarian armies have been seriously crippled by their losses on the Russian and Italian fronts is evidenced by Vien-na despatches which announced today that Hungarian Lanstrum forces of all years from 1885 to 1897, inclusive, have been ordered to report for active service on August 28. This call will furnish reinforcements of 275,000 men.

Washington, Aug. 14.—Permission to re-establish American Red Cross units in Germany is being sought of the Germany government. Announce-ment at Red Cross headquarters here today described the step as taken in order to make possible the sending of Red. Cross supplies to the Central Powers, which the British govern-ment announced it is willing to allow in Galicia, particularly in the Stanis-lau region, where the Russians are delivering attacks unceasingly. The official Austrian statement of Sunday reports the repuise of several Russian assaults.
