## SHOWED METTLE IN FLAMING SEA

Crew of H. M. S. Navinasia Rowed to Safety The Sheets of Burning Tal

Fire broke out late one evening in a large warehouse on the riverside filled with tallow piece goods, oil, wood and other inflammable materials. Fanned by the breeze, the flames spread so rapidly that they were beyond the power of the town fire brigade to quell. H. M. S. Newcasile lay at anchor and landed every officer and man she could spare.

They mounted their pump on the wharf, using sea water, and manned it in relays, while other men worked the hose. The place was already a furnace, however. Tin cans of tallow melted with the heat, and the mixture flowed in streams into the sea, there to congeal into a solid mass, which later ignited until the river became a mass of flames.

Soon the river of fire set alight to the ships' boats as they lay alongside the wharf, and the officer in charge ordered a retreat to save them. One crew had to row through a sea of figning tallow to escape. One boat caught fire from end to end, and to save it and to effect their own escape from the wharf, now surrounded by flame, the crew were compelled to walk through a morass of fiery tallow.


