

McLELAN, Hon. ARCHIBALD WOODBURY. (*Londonderry.*)

Of Irish origin. Only s. of the late G. W. McLelan, Esq., who sat in the N.S. Assembly for a lengthened period. B. at Londonderry, N.S., Dec. 1824. Ed. there and at Mount Allison Wesleyan Academy. M., 1854, Miss Caroline Metzler, of Halifax. A dir. of the Cobequid Marine Insurance Company. Sat for Colchester in N.S. Assembly from 1858 until 1863, for Northern Colchester from latter date until the Union, and for Colchester in House of Commons from the Union until called to the Senate, 21 June 1869. Apptd. one of the Commrs. for the construction of the Intercolonial Railway, June 1869. Was opposed to Confederation until "better terms" were yielded to Nova Scotia. Sworn a member of the Cabinet and appointed President of the Privy Council, Aug. 1881, on which occasion he resigned his seat in the Senate and appealed to his old constituency, Colchester, Mr. McKay, the sitting member, having resigned. Was opposed by Mr. Charles Cummings, but elected by a large majority.—*Londonderry, N.S.; 94 Queen Street, Ottawa.*

McLENNAN, JOHN. (*Glengarry.*)

Father emigrated from Scotland in 1802 and served as clerk; was a soldier of the war of 1812 in a militia regiment, in which he obtained a commission; afterwards a schoolmaster, farmer, magistrate, and again a soldier in 1836, when he commanded a company of militia on duty for a year or two at Lancaster village. B. at Williamstown, in the Co. of Glengarry, in 1821. Ed. chiefly in common school in the county. M. in 1855. Engaged greater part of life in commercial pursuits. Has filled the office of Presdt. of the Montreal Board of Trade. Is Vice-President of the Merchants' Bank of Canada. First returned to Parl. at last g.e. A Liberal Conservative.—*By the Lake, Lancaster, Ont.*

McLEOD, WILLIAM MCKENZIE, M.D., J.P. (*Cape Breton.*)

Third s. of the Rev. Hugh McLeod, D.D., Minister of Sydney and Ex-Moderator of the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church in Canada, by Catherine, dau. of the late Rev. Hugh Ross, of Fearn, in Ross-shire, Scotland. B. at Sherwood House, Sydney, C.B., 4 July 1854. Ed. at Sydney Academy; Dalhousie College, Halifax, and at Bellevue Hospital Medical College, New York.
