HAGGART, Hon. JOHN GRAHAM, P.C. (*South Lanark*).

S. of John Haggart, Esq., formerly of Breadalbane, Perthshire, Scot., but latterly of Perth, Lanark, Ont., by Isabella Graham, of the Isle of Skye, Invernesshire, Scot. B. in Perth, Ont., 14 Nov., 1836. A mill-owner. Was for several years Mayor of Perth. An unsuccessful candidate for South Lanark in Leg. Assem., Ont., at g. e. 1867 and 1869. First returned to Parlt. at g. e., 1872; re-elected at g. e., 1874, 1878, 1882, 1887, 1891 and 1896. Sworn of the Privy Council, and apptd. Postmaster-General, 6 Aug., 1888, a position he held until Jan., 1892, when apptd. Minister of Railways and Canals. Was a mem. of the Macdonald, Abbott, Thompson, Bowell and Tupper Administrations until 8 July, 1896, when he retired with his Leader. A Liberal-Conservative.—*Perth, Ont.; Rideau Club.*

HACKETT, EDWARD (*Prince West, P.E.I.*)

Father and mother came from Irel. in the early part of the present century, and settled near St. Peter's, on the eastern end of the island, from whence they removed to Chatham, N.B., and back again to Tignish, P.E.I., about fifty years ago. B. at Tignish, 1840. Ed. there. M., 1860, Hannah Maria, third dau. of James Fitzgibbon, shipbuilder, Annapolis, N.S. Is a merchant. Was a J. P. from 1872 to 1876. Sat in the Leg. Assem., P.E.I., from 1876 to 1878. First returned to Parlt. at g. e., 1878, re-elected 1882; an unsuccessful candidate at g. e., 1887; and re-elected at g. e., 1896. Was an Inspector of Fisheries from 1st July, 1888, to June, 1896. A Conservative.—*Tignish, P.E.I.*

HALE, FREDERICK HARDING (*Carleton, N.B.*).
