

## BILL.

An Act to amend the Laws relative to Hawkers  
and Pedlers.

**W**HEREAS it is expedient to exempt persons employed only for the purposes hereinafter mentioned from the obligations to take out Licences as Hawkers or Pedlers, &c., be it therefore enacted, — Preamble.

- 5 That for and notwithstanding any thing in the Act of the Parliament of Upper Canada, passed in the fifty-sixth year of the Reign of King George the Third, and intituled, "*An Act for granting to His Majesty Duties on Li-*  
 10 "*cences to Hawkers, Pedlers and Petty Chapmen, and other trading persons therein mentioned,*" or in the Act of the Parliament of Lower Canada, passed in the thirty fifth year of the said Reign, and intituled, "*An Act for grant-*  
 15 "*ing to His Majesty duties on Licences to Hawkers, Pedlers and Petty Chapmen, and for regulating their trade;*  
 20 "*and for granting additional duties on Licences to persons for keeping houses of public entertainment, or for retail-*  
 25 "*ing wine, brandy, rum or other spirituous liquors in this Province, and for regulating the same, and for repealing the Act or Ordinance therein mentioned,*" or in any other Act or Law relating to Hawkers or Pedlers, nothing in the said Acts, or any of them, shall render it necessary for persons in the employ of any Temperance, Benevolent or Religious Society in this Province, to take out Licences as Hawkers or Pedlers, in order to enable them law-  
 fully to sell and peddle Temperance Tracts and other moral and religious publications under the direction of such Society.
