Attractive, interesting and informative, the Home Products number will be a timely contribution to the wonderful story of the strides which this young but vast and rapidly-progressing country is making.



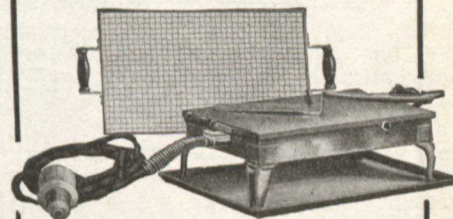
