
Meantime, Mathis says a ninemember board of directors has already been elected from among parents with children enrolled at the daycare.

"The Directors have been chosen so that each group that provided funding for the daycare is represented," said Mathis.

Funding for the facility came from several groups, some of which include the Graduate Student Association, the Student Union, Campus - representing mature and part-time students, the AUNBT - representing faculty and librarians, the UNB Employees Association and the administrations of both UNB and St. Thomas University.

Mathis said the Board of Directors plans to meet this week to elect officers for the coming year. Directors agree to serve for up to three years.

The daycare was completed this summer at a cost of approximately \$350,000. It is located on Montgomery Street near MacLeod and Magee residences.
