

Reduced census may take its toll

Government proposals to reduce the scope and content of the 1981 census of Canada because of economic cutback is a cause for concern, according to Mary Kainer, associate director of the Social Planning Council of Peel.

The council, which was formed in May of 1976 as an offshoot of Peel Social Services, has written a letter expressing its concern to local members of parliament and the planning department of the Region of Peel.

There are two sides of the coin as far as census taking goes, Kainer says. It can be viewed as an infringement of people's rights or it can be viewed as an effective and necessary aid to city planning.

Kainer takes the latter view. "Most departments just couldn't afford to undertake such a survey that is necessary for local planning," she says.

It's been 10 years since a complete census was taken in Canada compiling such information as ethnic

background, education, place of work, occupation, address, and mode of living.

From the federal viewpoint, a limited census is more viable, but from a municipal viewpoint, it is necessary that data from the 1971 census be correlated to the 1981 census to compare changes in Canadian society, she says.


The census is needed to determine electoral boundaries, for planning housing, industry and transportation routes, social agencies and the needs of day care, seniors' facilities and schools. It is also used extensively by marketing agencies, she points out.

By law, census taking is required every five years, she says. A very basic census was taken in 1976 but the Region of Peel has grown so dramatically since 1971 that a comparison census is needed, she says.

Statistics Canada staff have estimated cost of a complete 1981 census would be \$130 million (based on 1976 dollar values). Since this amount is \$40 million over the allocated budget, various options have been worked out to reduce the amount of data to be taken and thus limit the cost to anywhere from \$67 million to \$108 million.

However, if the census is carried out on a limited scale the Region of Peel feels that Ontario would have to carry out a further census — at enormous cost, according to Kainer.

The decision will be made by Statistics Canada in June of this year as to how broad the census is to be.






