He could not say what time it was when he got the liquos The Constable did not attempt to show that he was not near the Depot at any specified time; as, being the only Constable in the place and having to make his rounds, he might have gone there at any Judge Dugas took the case in delibere and on the 21 th Mltimes rendered judgment against the Constable and fines him \$ 5000 and costs or one month in jail. The Dept. is desirous of taking out an appeal from the decision of the Magnetrates who rendered judgment in the cases
