With reference to letter to you of the 1st instant, in which you were informed that you might make arrangements to have the two pupils Oscar Rathbun and Susie French sent to the Sanatorium at Weston, I beg to say that the reason for specifying that particular Institution was that other children have been sent there. Since writing it has been learned that the Weston Hospital is for advanced cases of tuberculosis, and that incipient cases are treated in the Miskoka Free Hospital. Before making definite arrangements with regard to these two children you should communicate with the Secretary of the National Sanatorium Association ^{King Street, West.} ~~Toronto~~. As before stated payment will be made at the usual rates, and no unnecessary expense should be incurred.
