Dear Sir:

Under date of January 1, 1914, we leased from the Department of Indian Affairs, certain lands: a part of the Semiahmoo Indian Reserve at White Rock. This lease was for twenty-one years, and still has ten years to run.

We are about to negotiate a loan in connection with our business in the way of debenture bonds, and we, therefore, find it necessary to either have the deed to the land or a longer lease. First, we would like to purchase the land covered by this lease, but if this is impossible, and you cannot grant us this privilege, may we have an extension to the lease of fifteen to twenty years?

We are particularly anxious to negotiate this loan during August, and therefore your consideration of this matter and a reply will be greatly appreciated.
