A MISSIONARY'S ADVENTURE.

How the Baptism of a Child Led to a Woman's Conversion.

The Father met with a cold reception, and though supper was served to him, the inmates spoke very few words, and these inmates spoke very few words, and these in an embsrassed and reserved manner.
