HARKINS ACADEMY ON FIRE YESTERDAY

The Fire Department was called out yesterday afternoon about 4 o'clock for a fire at Harkins Academy. The fire originated in a waste paper room, under the stairway leading into the boys' basement. It is unknown how the paper became ignited, but when first seen the flames were eating into the walls. School had been dismissed but a number of the teachers including Principal J.A. Barnett and some of the pupils were still in the building. The alarm was immediately sent in and on arrival of the firemen the flames were burning briskly. Several streams of water were soon playing which speedily quenched the flames. Fortunately the fire was checked in its early stages, thus preventing a serious conflagration, which might have developed into larger proportions and caused the destruction of this valuable school building.

HUSBAND ARRESTED FOR BEATING WIFE

Information was laid before Mayor D.S. Creaghan, yesterday morning by Mrs. Joseph Napke against her husband, Joseph Napke, a dry goods and hardware merchant of this town charging him with assault and beating and occasioning actual bodily harm to her. Early Monday morning, Mrs. Napke called at the Police Station for help and was followed to the Police Station by her husband, who was arrested by Night Policeman Edward Walsh. Chief of Police John H. Ashford interviewed Mrs. Napke in the morning and found it necessary to have a physician called to attend to her injuries. Dr. J.E. Park assisted by Nursing Sister Mrs. Chas. H. Gough, examined the patient and afterwards had her removed to the Miramichi Hospital for treatment. Mr. Napke came before Mayor Creaghan yesterday morning and was granted bail in \$500 of personal surety and two others of \$250 each, to appear on Tuesday, March 4th.
