Crabb and others re planking sidewalks be laid over for further consideration; that tenders be asked for block paving the street crossings around the square and one crossing opposite the new post-office, crossings to be 8 ft. wide; that the sidewalks be curbed and put in proper shape, and on the sidewalks on the main streets a top dressing of fine gravel be put.
