WISCONSIN CENTRAL NO LONGER

Recently C.P.R. Acquired System Will Be Known as Detroit Branch.

Milwaukee, Wis., April 13.—The Wisconsin Central Railroad now loses all identity, except in its incorporate name in legal affairs.

This is the subject of statements issued immediately following the formal taking over of the Wisconsin Central Railroad properties by the Minneapolis, St. Paul & Sault Ste Marie Railway Company.

The Wisconsin Central road is now a part of the Great Canadian Pacific system after having been fully transferred to the "So" line, the agreements between the two companies, heretofore authorized by their respective boards, being ratified and approved by the largest vote ever cast, more than 90 per cent.
