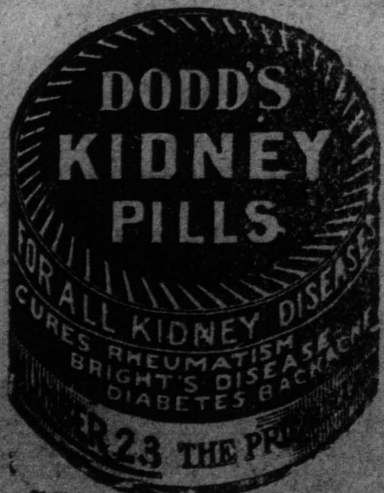

**The Amending Bill.**

The second reading of the Home Rule Amending Bill by the House of Lords shows that the Lords realize at last that a perilous state of affairs exists in Ireland and that something in the way of conciliation must be done in order to cope with the situation in Ireland. The fact that the vote on division stood at 273 to 10, show that the irreconcilable element in the House of Lords have been reduced to a negligible quantity.  
 It appears to us idle to expect that the difficulties will be surmounted without prolonged discussion, but it is also clear that the spirit of the majority in the House of Lords has undergone a change and there is a recognition that a way out of the difficulties must be found. Ireland is resolving itself into two armed camps of Home Rulers and Anti-Home Rulers, and party advantages must be sunk to avoid a clash between these forces. Perilous as the state of Ireland is, it must be remembered that the organization and discipline of these forces will have a tendency to restrain sporadic outbreaks, so it will have its effect on both Unionists, Liberals and Nationalists in stimulating them to make every effort to come to an understanding that it will avoid the disasters of an organized civil war.
