Solos by Misses G. Strang, J. Strang, L. Anderson, D. Johnston, Mrs. W. C. Job, and Mr. F. Ruggles; a French horn selection by Mr. A. Bulley; a recitation by Miss M. Doyle; a violin solo by Miss S. Johnson, and a duet by the Misses Strang completed the programme.

The selections were faultlessly rendered and won well merited applause. At the close His Excellency the Governor congratulated Conductor Stirling, who was highly pleased with the success that attended his efforts. The Nickel

Has Another Striking All Feature Show To-Day.
