Mess pork is held at \$\$ 27\$; Bacon (Cumberland cut) \$\$ 11.50 to \$\$ 12\$; hams, in salt, 12 to 13 cents; lard, 16 to 17 cents; butter, 20 to 21 cents; store packed, 19 to 20 cents; cheese, 11 to 12. 4,000 bushels of spring wheat were brought in on Tuesday, which were disposed of at prices quoted. Very little barley is coming in, and in poultry there is scarcely anything doing. During this week the "Wellington Packing House shipped for the English market, 3,000 hams, 2,000 sides of bacon, 100 keps of lard, 200 barrels pork and 200 kegs of butter. The heavy fall of snow on Tuesday night has given us good sleighing once more, and it is probable that a general decline in quotations will shortly take place.


