MR. JAMES ROSS ELECTED. SPLENDID VICTORY!!

After a hard fought battle, Mr. James Ross, the old, tried and faithful representative of Centre Wellington, has again been rejected by 84 of a majority. From the first it was felt by the parties who knew both the men well that the contest would be keen.

The manipulation of the Riding by the Government was also to his disadvantage. Two of the finest Reform townships in the County were taken from it, and the Township of Peel added, which though largely Reform, is still of such a character politically that gave Dr. Orton and his friends good reason to hope that if they could not get a majority there, they would at least hold their own.

Splendid Victories on Tuesday.

Five elections were held in Ontario on Tuesday—Peel, Centre Wellington, North Waterloo, Dundas and Stormont—and in all these the Reform cause was triumphant. Peel, Dundas and Stormont were held last Parliament by Conservatives, but they have been gained from the enemy, making nine in all in Ontario since the contest commenced.

John Hillyard Cameron Defeated. Mr. Smith's majority over J. H. Cameron is only 10; but there is great rejoicing, nevertheless, over the Reform victory. The Globe says Cameron takes his defeat with very bad grace.
