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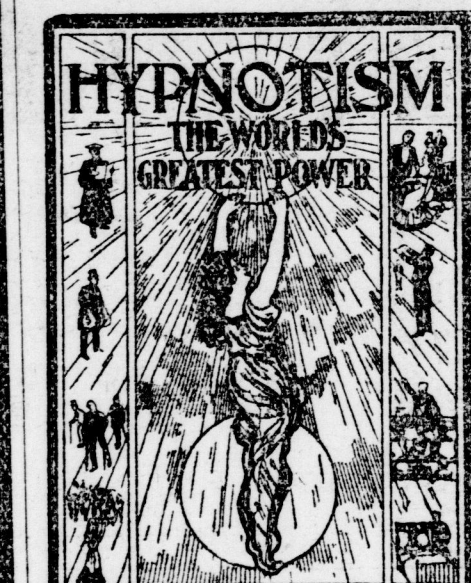

BOTHA BELIEVES IN BOERS' LOYALTY

Says They Will Lose No Time in Coming In.

THE LONELINESS OF LONDON

Leads to the Institution of the Colonial Troops' Club—A \$50,000 Fee.

London, June 7.—Highly satisfactory news continues to come from South Africa. Mr. Bennett Burleigh has been assured by Gen. Botha that the burghers will loyally observe the capitulation and will lose no time in tendering their submission.

COLONIAL TROOPS' CLUB.

London, June 7.—The loneliness of London to those who come to it as strangers in a strange land is the justification of the Colonial Troops' Club. It is mainly intended for the entertainment of colonial troops in London for the coronation, and Mr. Chamberlain yesterday undertook the very congenial task of performing the opening ceremony. He enlarged upon the debt which Britain owes the colonies in connection with the Boer war for moral as well as material assistance. They saw with keenness and instinct, which were not surpassed by even the loudest applause was reserved for the statement that the colonies had sent an army to South Africa greater in number than the British army at Waterloo.

TEXAS CATTLE FOR BOERS.

A big deal in Texas cattle had its initiative in the recent shipment of 6,500 head of such cattle from Pensacola, Fla. It is the first of many shipments of cattle to South Africa, to be used in restocking the depleted veldts. It is understood that Maud & Carrow, of Fort Worth, Texas, have a contract to supply the British Government with young breeding cattle in South Africa. The shipment from Pensacola consisted of high grades and pure-blooded cattle.

SURRENDER OF 1,500 BOERS.

Cape Town, June 7.—The surrender of over 1,500 Boers has already been reported, covering various points. Commandant Fouché brought his command into Cradock, Cape Colony, consisting of 25 Free Staters and 212 rebels. Fouché is ill.

CHEERED FOR KING EDWARD.

KRUGER'S CHOICE.

It is reported here that Mr. Kruger has declined the facilities offered by Great Britain for his return to South Africa, but has accepted Queen Wilhelmina's offer of a Dutch vessel to convey him to South Africa when he decides to return there.

THE ALL-BRITISH SHIPPING COMBINE

May Not, After All, Turn Out To Be an Assured Actuality.

EARLY REPORTS DISCREDITED.

The Barings, Lord Strathcona, and Other Prominent Men Not Cognizant of the Scheme.

London, June 7.—The statements which have recently appeared in the English press, and which forecasted the formation of an all-British shipping combination seem to be open to grave doubts. Judging from careful inquiries made by the Associated Press in the most influential quarters of London, almost all of what has so far been printed is not only premature, but inspired, and its purpose is to assist toward the realization of the shipping project, which is almost as visionary today as it was a month ago.

DUBIOUS STATEMENTS.

The circumstantiality with which these published reports have been adorned contrasts strangely with the statements of those who believe that such a combine would probably be futile. Even the cardinal point upon which these published stories were hung, namely, the utilization of Canadian subsidies, seems to be untrue. In face of recent remarks on this matter of Joseph J. Tarte, Canadian minister of public works, the Associated Press has been officially informed that Lord Strathcona and Mount Royal, high commissioner for Canada, has received no proposition with respect to Canadian subsidies, and so far as the high commissioner knows the offer of the Canadian Government of subsidies, which still open, has not been negotiated for.

Such negotiations might be made direct to Ottawa, but it would be a curious coincidence if Lord Strathcona and Mount Royal, in his dual position of Canadian high commissioner and a large holder of shares of the Canadian Pacific Railway, were ignorant of the occurrence.

Lord Rothschild, whose financial assistance in the proposed shipping combine would almost certainly be asked, has not heard a word of the combine, with the exception of what he has seen in the newspapers, and these reports he appears to discredit.

Barings, who are intimately connected with mercantile finance, entire discredit the possibility and advisability of British opposition to the American shipping combine.

A VISIONARY PROJECT.

One of the leading figures in the English business world, whose name ranks with that of the Rothschilds, said yesterday: "Personally, I have not heard a word, which makes me think that this British project is other than a visionary one. If it materialized it would not have the support of the best financial circles of England. It is an entirely unnecessary step, and you may be sure that the leading men of England not only do not share in the press agitation over this matter, but deprecate any suggestion of a report to what is so hysterically called American aggression. There is no necessity for such a combine so long as Americans are willing to pay twenty shillings on the pound. It is much better that England should understand that the statements published in the newspapers are quite unauthorized."

THE MORGANS UNDISTURBED.

"The Morgans are quite undisturbed at the press reports of the proposed combine or at Mr. Tarte's speech. Their information, which is obviously likely to be correct, leads to the belief that absolutely nothing has been accomplished between the British ship owners, and that there is small probability of any satisfactory basis of operations being reached. The Morgans, it is mentioned in connection with the British combine were spontaneously offered to the Morgan interests, and promptly refused by them."

Sir Alfred Jones, chairman of Elder Dempster & Co., who is supposed to be one of the most prominent movers in the new combine, said this afternoon that he could not make any statement at present.

THE CONGREGATIONALISTS

Discuss Referendum and Will Vote for Prohibition.

Manitoba Prohibitionists Arrange to Hold a Convention.

Ottawa, June 7.—The Congregational Union of Ontario and Quebec yesterday morning discussed the referendum in Ontario on prohibition, and recommended through resolution that the members of the church turn out in strength and vote for prohibition.

Winnipeg, Man., June 7.—The executive of the Dominion Alliance for the province decided to call a provincial convention of the alliance during the exhibition week in Winnipeg, at which the future policy of the alliance will be finally defined. It was also decided to ask that each local branch in the provincial constituencies see that a candidate in the next local election is secured, who can be depended upon to give independent support to the cause of prohibition.

Woodstock, June 6.—At the morning session of the Hamilton Conference today, a resolution, moved by Rev. T. J. Parr, expressive of the loyalty of the Methodist denomination to King Edward VII. and the British Empire, was enthusiastically carried by the entire gathering rising and singing "God Save the King." The motion also congratulated the King on the prospects now in sight for a magnificent coronation, and that the peace has been consummated in South Africa.
