HON. ARTHUR MEIGEN TALKS ON THE WAR

Urges Canadians To Take the Great Struggle More Seriously.

ST. THOMAS, Jan. 7.—There was a good attendance at the luncheon given by the Canadian Club in the auditorium at the Engineers' building Thursday.

President F. B. Holtby presided, and Hon. Arthur Meigen, solicitor-general of Canada, was the guest of honor. He made a splendid address, confining his remarks to the war, and stated that Canada was vitally interested in this terrible struggle.

He urged strongly upon his hearers to let the war absorb every man's mind until the conclusion. The Canadian people, he declared, the castigation of the German Emperor that they are a decadent people, unless they untiringly work for the best interests of the empire.

Fears No Panic.
The speaker feared no panic among the Canadian people. He thought he knew them well enough to say that under a stress of war there was no fear of any such panic, but that they could rise to an occasion.

Mr. Meigen pointed out that the British Imperial Government had made every effort to avoid war, but that it was thrust upon them. He believed England was right, and that her action would be vindicated.

An Essential End.
The speaker said the German people believed war was an essential evil, which had been borne for centuries by the greatest of suffering, while the other school of thought took the direct opposite view. The German authors and philosophers were not the teachers, but the exponents of German thought.

Triumphant Brutality.
Mr. Meigen in closing his address said in part: "If there is any mercy in us when we hear the wail of suffering Belgium, and the gloating of the triumphant butchery, surely this will teach us that the essential goal of civilization is to get rid of war. How are we to describe what will come over us if we fail? We conceive even partial success impossible. So thorough has been the work of British diplomacy that defeat or partial success is utterly out of the question. The Canadian Government stood ready to bankrupt the country to bring victory to Britain and the flag we love."

ROMANIA PREPARES TO JOIN THE ALLIES

Reported Arrangements Made To Break Relations With Enemies.

PARIS, Jan. 7.—It is learned from a private source, but from one worthy of credence, that arrangements whereby the interests of Roumania in Berlin and Vienna will be attended to by the United States diplomatic service, have been definitely made.

NOTED ENGINEER DIES

OTTAWA, Jan. 7.—Thomas Coltrin Keefe, C. E., C. M. E., one of Canada's most noted engineers, died at his home here today in his 94th year.

At one time he was president of the Society of American Engineers, and was one of the founders of the Canadian Association of Civil Engineers.

In 1887 he was Canadian commissioner at the first international exhibition in London, and in 1875 was executive commissioner of the Paris exposition, and was elected an officer of the Legion of Honor. For some years he was engineer of the Montreal Harbor Commission.
