ARGUMENTS FEW

Prevailing hot weather had its effect upon members of the city council, and last night's session as a result was a short and snappy affair. It was too hot for argument, and as there were few if any items on the agenda of a contentious nature, business flowed along smoothly.

Ald. Frank McKay presented the 14th report of No. 1 committee, which was adopted clause by clause. Tenders for 500 feet of fire hose were awarded to each of the following companies: Dominion Rubber System, Gutta Percha Co., Dunlop Rubber Co., and Goodyear Rubber Co. Authorization was given for the installation of 19 new fire hydrants at various strategic points throughout the city, as recommended by the public utilities commission. Laying of a 6-inch main on Bathurst street east of Adelaide street was referred to the public utilities commission for a recommendation.

The invitation of the Trades and Labor council to attend the Labor Day celebration was accepted, and as many of the aldermen as possible will be present. The suggestion of the city engineer was adopted that the lighting on the block on Dundas street between Wellington and Wat-erloo streets be curtailed by decreas-ing the wattage to the same as the rest of Dundas street, and the excess street lighting charge on the block reduced to the same rate as on Dundas street west, the city absorbing the difference in the general street lighting rate. The letter of the public utilities commission offering to purchase the sulphur springs property was received, but no action was taken as there is at the present time a prospective purchaser whose option does not expire until November 1. A bylaw authorizing the sale of the property was given two readings, but the third reading was laid over until the next council meeting.

The date on which the local depositors in the Home Bank are to receive the relief provided by the government is still uncertain. When seen this morning, U. A. Buchner said he had as yet received no reply from Ottawa regarding his query as to when payment might be expected. Mr. Buchner is looking after the interests of the local depositors. Mr. Buchner is leaving Friday to But Association in Winnipeg and will not return till early in September. If any action towards payment should be taken during that period the mar-ket branch of the Bank of Montrea will be the headquarters for depositors, arrangements having been made for it to commence payments
