Interesting Talk by Dr. Sara Detweiler to the W.C.T.U.

At the June meeting of the W.C.T.U. held in the Y.W.C.A. parlors the annual reports were read and the superintendents of departments appointed for the coming year. The local union takes up sixteen different departments of work.

After the devotional and business half-hour Dr. Sara Detweiler addressed the members on the work of the Travellers' Aid. The Doctor is connected with this department of work in Lethbridge Alberta. Travellers' Aid work is being carried on by the W.C.T.U. at the larger stations with the object of assisting and protecting travellers particularly women and girls.

Frequently travellers start out either to visit friends, whose addresses they are not sure of or in search of employment and frequently are taken advantage of by unworthy individuals.

The Travellers' Aid aims to help just such as these and find much to do, especially at places where travellers have to wait several hours between trains. The local union collects Surprise Soap Wrappers to help finance this work. The work is as yet in its infancy but it is the hope of the Dominion Council that ere long a complete network of Travellers' Aid will stretch across the Dominion to assist and protect our women travellers.
