Susponsions - Many delinquent members do not realize the danger in which they place their families by neglect of a plain obligation. The law of our Association is very clear. If a member neglects to pay his assess ments "on or before the 3rd, day of the next ensuing month" he stands suspended by his own act of neglect. The mere fact the Financial Secretary does not report his suspension is not material as to the consequences. Should be die while under suspension his beneficiaries have no claim on the Association, because such members had not fulfilled his own obligation.
