MEETINGS OF PRESBYTERIES.

KINGSTON.

HELD an adjourned meeting in Cooke's church, Kingston, on the 8th inst. A call from G. Enave, Harrowmuth and Wilton in favour of the Rev. George Porteous was sustained, and accepted.

PARIS.

A SPECIAL meeting of Paris Presbytery was held in St. Andrew's church, Ingersoll, Oct. 15th. Representatives of the Session and congregation were heard in reference to Mr. Ross's resignation...

BRANDON.

MET at High Bluff according to adjournment on Tuesday, Oct. 27th and was constituted by the Rev. F. Wright, B.D., Moderator, pro tem., with whom were present, Rev. T. C. Curt and T. R. Shearer and John B. Aton, Elder, Messrs. A. J. McLeod and J. A. P. Sutherland, ordained ministers, being present, were invited to correspond. M. Sutherland, in the absence of the stated Clerk was appointed Clerk pro tem.

The principal business before the Presbytery was the ordination of Mr. M. C. Rumbal, and his induction into the congregation of High Bluff and Prospect. Evidence having been afforded that the candidate had been read on two successive Sabbaths, and the usual preparation before the assembly made, Rev. Mr. Shearer proceeded to the pulpit and preached from Heb. xii. 14. After the pulpit service, the Moderator narrated the steps taken in connection with the call and put the questions prescribed by the Church for those about to enter ministry, which were duly answered by Mr. Rumbal: whereupon, by prayer and the laying on of the hands of the Presbytery, Mr. M. C. Rumbal was ordained to the ministry of the Gospel of Jesus Christ, and inducted into the pastoral charge of High Bluff congregation. The newly ordained minister was addressed, in most appropriate words, by Rev. Mr. Wright, and the people, in equally suitable terms, by Rev. Mr. Curt. Having declared his willingness to subscribe the Formula when presented, Mr. Rumbal took his seat as a member of Court, and the Clerk was instructed to add his name to the Presbytery rolls. The people most cordially welcomed their pastor at the conclusion of the public services, who enters upon an encouraging field of labour among a warmly attached people. The Presbytery next proceeded to take up a call from the Carberry congregation. Mr. Court reported he had moderated a call in the Carberry church on 16th Sept. he had come out in favour of Rev. G. C. Paterson, that it was unanimous and cordial, and that the stipend promised was one thousand dollars a year without a name. Mr. Wm. Logan appeared as a commissioner from the Carberry congregation and was heard in connection with the call. Mr. Logan testified as to the heartiness and unanimity of the people in calling Mr. Paterson, their earnest desire to have him speedily settled among them as their pastor, and his belief that his presence in their midst would be the means of great good in every respect to the congregation he represented. On motion, Mr. Court's conduct in moderating in the call was approved, the call sustained as a regular Gospel call, and the Moderator, Mr. Wright, directed to forward it without delay to Mr. Paterson, whose present address is Toronto, Ont. The Presbytery, having learned that the

congregation of Portage la Prairie, Rev. Mr. Wright, pastor, was about to enlarge their place of worship, the present seating capacity of their church being altogether inadequate for the accommodation of its increasing congregation, expressed its high gratification at the indication of prosperity granted under its new pastor, evidenced by this pleasing fact. After several reports of duty fulfilled by members of court, the Presbytery adjourned with the benediction, to hold its next regular meeting at Brandon on the second Tuesday of December.—Com.

WINNIPEG.

HELD a pro re nata meeting on the 17th inst. Mr. Beard reported that since the last meeting of the Presbytery, at which the last Presbytery had refused to sustain the call from Fort William to Mr. J. L. Simpson, because it had not a sufficient number of signatures, he had received notice that an additional number had been obtained, making the whole number now up to sixty-five members and forty-nine adherents. It was moved by Dr. Bryce, seconded by Dr. Agnew, and agreed, that the Presbytery, while noting the irregularity in connection with the call, sustain it and order it to be transmitted to Mr. Simpson in Toronto. In the event of Mr. Simpson accepting the call, it was agreed that the induction be held in the church at Fort William, East, on Tuesday, the 5th of November, at 3 p.m.; the Rev. Mr. Neilly, of Schreiber, to preach, and Rev. Mr. Pringle, of Port Arthur, to preside and address the minister, and that Rev. Mr. Nairn, of Rat Portage, address the people. The congregation of Poplar Point asked for a grant of \$120 to enable the congregation to complete its church which is now being built, and is to cost \$600. Dr. King moved, and it was agreed, that the application be forwarded to the church and manse building board, with a cordial recommendation that the request be granted. A petition was presented from Keewatin, asking to have the benefits of the services of a resident minister, instead of a continuance of the present arrangement by which services are given in connection with Rat Portage. It was moved by Dr. King, seconded by Rev. Joseph Hogg, and agreed, that the Presbytery, having heard the application of the members of Keewatin congregation, would express its gratification at the application, and its sympathy with the people in their desire to have a resident minister to watch over them; but, in the absence of the Moderator of the Rat Portage Session, and of any communication from the Rat Portage congregation, it felt itself precluded at this stage from taking final action in this regard. It also agreed to notify the Rat Portage congregation of the application, and summon it to appear for its interests at the next meeting of the Presbytery, when final action will be taken; and, in justice to the important interests at stake, it empowers the Home Mission Committee to arrange the best supply in the meantime as will best safeguard those interests. The committee on the examination of students who have resided during the summer within the bounds of the Presbytery, reported that sermons had been examined, and that suggestions and criticisms had been appended, and that the students are now certified to the college board. Messrs. And. Brown, A. Chisholm, S. W. Thompson, J. L. Small, Alan Moore, James Buchanan, A. C. Manson, W. O. Wallace, H. F. Ross and Jonas Johnson. Three students had not sent in exercises and it was agreed that these receive a second notification to comply with the requirements of the General Assembly. It was moved by Dr. King, seconded by Prof. Hays, and agreed, that any students who wish to enter the theological department of the college be required to confer with this committee, of which, Rev. James Douglas is convener, and that the committee be empowered to certify them to the college Senate. Mr. Simpson has notified the Presbytery, by telegram, of his acceptance of the call.—ANDREW B. BAIRD, Clerk.

WHITBY.

MET at Oshawa, on Oct. 15th the Rev. A. Leslie, of Newtonville, Moderator. All the ministerial members were present and a fair representation of elders. After disposing of some matters of little interest to the public, the Presbytery entered on the consideration of the Remits sent down by the Assembly. (1) On the constitution of the Assembly, it was resolved that no change be made for the present; (2) The appointment of a secretary for the Sabbath Schools. This was remitted to the Committee on Sabbath Schools, with instructions to report at next meeting; (3) The Aged and Infirm Ministers' Fund. This also was remitted to the representative of that Fund. Mr. Fraser, of Bowmanville, was welcomed back by the Presbytery after a six months' trip to Europe. He looks greatly improved in health and ready to throw himself into his work again. A very interesting report was read by him on Systematic Beneficence, which was received and adopted with its recommendations. If the plans proposed can be carried out, all our congregations will be greatly benefited. Mr. Fraser was instructed to present an overture on this subject to the Synod of Toronto and Kingston at its next meeting. Mr. McKee's name was substituted for Mr. Fraser's as Convener of the Committee on Temperance. The Session records of Claremont and Pickering were examined and attested in the usual manner. Mr. E. M. read a report of a visit of the committee to the congregations of Bonskillen and Cartwright, which was adopted by the Presbytery. A similar report was given in by Mr. Abraham of a visit of the committee to Ashburn and Uca; the Presbytery expressed its satisfaction with the hopeful condition of the charge. Mr. Wikie, the esteemed missionary, of Indore, India, was present and gave a very interesting address on his work at Indore. The Presbytery recognizing the importance of educational work in the present stage of our Mission in Central India and grateful to God for his successful beginning, express satisfaction with the appointment of the Rev. J. Wikie as Principal of the College at Indore, and sympathy with the effort he is now making to raise \$10,000 for a college building there, and commend it to the liberality of the congregations and members of Presbytery. The Presbytery hereby pledge themselves to do all in

power, personally, to aid him in obtaining the required sum. The Session of St. John's, Pickering, gave in a report in reference to the burying-ground on the seventh line. They would be pleased if the Claremont Session would co-operate with them in maintaining and enlarging the said burying-ground. Mr. Drummond laid on the table his resignation of the congregation of Newcastle on the ground of continued ill-health. The Presbytery expressed its sympathy with Mr. Drummond and the congregation and resolved to take the usual steps and cite the congregation to appear for their interests at the meeting of Presbytery in January next. The notices sent down by the Home Mission and Augmentation Committees, naming the sums this Presbytery would be expected to raise for these schemes were read, as also the abstract for all the Schemes of the Church. These papers were handed over to the several Convener of the Presbytery concerned, with instructions to take such action as they thought best to raise the amounts named. Mr. Fraser, in accordance with previous notice, moved that it be desirable that the Presbytery should hold an evening sederunt at two of its quarterly meetings with a view to conference and discussion upon matters relating to the spiritual life and work of the Church. This was agreed to and arrangements were left with a committee for holding the first meeting in Bowmanville, on the evening of the third Tuesday of January.—A. A. DRUMMOND, Clerk.

TORONTO.

MET in the usual place on the 1st inst. Rev. Walter Amos, Moderator. A letter was read from Mr. A. MacMurchy, thanking the Presbytery for their minute of sympathy with him in regard to his late domestic bereavement, as also for their kindly recognition of the personal worth and devoted services of one who was much loved, and is now greatly missed. Messrs. John A. McKenzie, Thomas Bell, John R. Sinclair and Albert D. Camp, all of them certified members of the Church, offered themselves for examination, with a view to their being admitted as students at Knox College. A committee was appointed to examine and confer with them, and, as afterwards recommended by said committee, they were ordered to be attested to the Senate of said College. As convener of the committee appointed at last meeting to organize the people who meet for worship in St. George's Hall, Rev. W. Fr. Zwill reported that he had written to representatives of said people proposing a meeting for the purpose named, when he was given to understand that such organization was not desired in the meantime. The report was received, and the committee was continued for a time longer. It was then reported by Rev. R. Hadow that he had acted on the appointment assigned to him at last meeting, and that owing to exertions made by the ladies of Omagh congregation, the amount, due to their late minister had been duly promised, and would probably be paid within a week. The Presbytery was gratified with this report. An application was read from the congregation of St. Mark's church, Toronto, requesting the Presbytery to take steps to moderate in a call, and promising that a guarantee for the payment of an annual stipend of \$1,200, will be ready on the day of moderation. In support of this application Messrs. Hudson, Joss and Dale appeared as commissioners, and were severally heard. Thereafter, the prayer of the application was granted, and Rev. D. J. Macdonnell was appointed to moderate at such a time as he might arrange for. The committee, appointed at last meeting to organize a regular congregation at Seaton Village, reported, through Rev. A. Gilray, that they had held a meeting with the people referred to, and had constituted forty-two members in that locality a regular congregation, under the jurisdiction of the Presbytery, and further, that the people so organized wished to be known, henceforth, as the congregation of St. Paul's church, Toronto. The report of the committee was received and adopted; and the wish of the congregation, as just stated, was also conceded; moreover, on motion made and agreed to, the brethren composing this committee were appointed to act as an interim Session. As convener of the Presbytery's Committee on Sabbath Schools, Rev. J. Neil submitted a number of statements about the Assembly's Syllabus for Higher Christian Instruction in such institutions, and advised that the Presbytery heartily commended said Syllabus to the different congregations throughout the bounds. The Presbytery agreed to commend accordingly. There was read a copy of a resolution adopted by the congregation of Charles street church, Toronto, instructing the Moderator of their Session to ask authority from the Presbytery to borrow from \$30,000 to \$40,000, with a view to the erection of their new church on Bloor street east. The Moderator of their Session was heard thereon, and authority was given to the said congregation in accordance with the terms of their resolution. It was reported by Rev. J. A. Grant that, after intimation duly given, he had met with those of Mimico and its neighbourhood, who had previously petitioned for church organization, that from sixteen of these persons he had received certificates of Church membership, that with other two of them he had dealt in the way of examination, and that these eighteen persons he had organized as a mission congregation, under the jurisdiction of the Presbytery. The action of Rev. Mr. Grant was approved by the Presbytery and an interim Session was also appointed. A paper was then read from said congregation setting forth application to the Presbytery for leave to borrow \$100 for the purpose of erecting a church, whereupon it was moved by Dr. MacLaren, that the Presbytery express satisfaction with steps taken by the congregation at Mimico for the erection of a church, and agree to grant leave to the congregation to mortgage their property as soon as they have secured a deed for the same. A schedule of appointments for the Foreign Mission Fund was submitted and read by Rev. D. Kellogg; another for the Augmentation Fund by Rev. D. J. Macdonnell; and another for the College Fund by Rev. J. Muir; which schedules were adopted by the Presbytery. But several other schedules, which were not ready, will have to be added to the foregoing, in order to provide a full exhibit of what sums will be asked within the bounds or contributions to the Schemes of the Church.—R.
