Warm yrater is cn excellent thing for cows giving milk; it is as goid as tro or three quarts of nucal a day. but if yun rais meal ani shurte with it coma must be allowanced, as they will dxink too much- yough to diminith hofory of mill. The quantits will vary with the char: acter of feed and the cow. A little good judgment is a ance thing here, as everywhere else.

Mares in Foal.-Tho best trestunent for a mare in foal is to give her moderato exercise dails, caro being taken arainat orer-exertion. The food shonild be good cloverand timothy hay, well cut and salted, ground oats, and a bran mash mixed with potatoos or other roots. Fead samo corn or meal, but not too much in order to guard against milk forcr. The colt should reliepe the udder as soon as guourd raicre the
possiblo after birth.
