

MR. WARREN was born April 10, 1921, near Chatham, Ontario, and received his Bachelor of Arts Degree from Queens University in Kingston. Following service with the Royal Canadian Navy during World War II, he joined the Department of External Affairs, and in 1948 was posted to the High Commission for Canada in London.

Mr. Warren returned to Ottawa in November 1951, and was transferred to the Department of Finance in 1954. He was posted to the Canadian Embassy in Washington as Financial Counsellor, and was also appointed Alternate Executive Director for Canada to the International Monetary Fund and International Bank for Reconstruction and Development.

On returning to the Department of External Affairs in 1957, he was posted to the Permanent Delegation of Canada to NATO and the Organization for European Economic Co-operation, with special responsibility for European regional economic developments.

In September 1958, he was appointed Assistant Deputy Minister of Trade and Commerce.

Mr. Warren has represented Canada at many international conferences concerned with trade and economic affairs. In September 1960, he was elected Chairman of the Council of Representatives of the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade, and was Deputy Chairman of the Canadian Delegation of the GATT Tariff Conference, held in Geneva, Switzerland, in 1960 and 1961.
