autumn, and as a result of the Headmasters' advice, twenty of them came to McGill, eight went to Queens, three to Toronto, while one has gone to the Guelph Agricultural Cellege and another to British Columbia. I should think the heads of English public schools were fairly good judges, and their judgment would hardly seem to coincide with that of Dr. Leacock, who, of course, is a graduate of an Ontario school and naturally knows much more of those schools than he does of Quebec schools or schools in other parts of Canada. You probably have lived long enough, Mrs. Wigle, to know how silly and false comparisons can be.
