VETERANS ATTEND DIVINE SERVICE

Rev. Canon Dixon Preached to Northwest Field Force Association.

The Northwest Field Force Association, veterans of 1885, held its annual parade for divine service at Trinity Church, East King street, yesterday morning.

The parade of 125 veterans of those stirring times of 1885, started from the armories at 10.30 a.m., headed by the Trinity Church Bugle Band, under Drum-Major Moodie. Mr. Dixon compared the veterans of the Northwest rebellion of 28 years ago. He picked out many noted men who had been brave in the past wars and compared them with men of the gospel. In the course of his remarks he stated that if the men of Toronto were as courageous and God-fearing as those great generals of the past, who received great benefit in their struggles thru prayer and trusting in God, there would be more Christianity and more people converted in Toronto. The service was concluded with the national anthem. At the conclusion of the service they lined up in front of the church and marched to the armories, from where they dispersed to their homes.
