inches by nine inches, and mounted on a twenty-four inch stick, is a good standard size. Have them larger $\frac{1}{2}$ rather than smaller.

WHEEL.

The girls will form up in twos in the ante-room, and come down the centre of the stage, a flag in each hand, the inside flag of each girl crossed with her partner's. When the line reaches the front of the stage, it will halt for a moment, then the first twelve girls (i.e., the first six pairs) will turn a quarter of a circle to the right, and face the right of the stage ; the last twelve (i.s., the last six pairs) will turn a guarter of a circle to the left, and face the left of the stage. As each girl turns she will bring both flags in front of her, holding her hands in a line with her shoulders. The eleventh, twelfth, thirteenth, and fourteenth girls will slowly turn, as on a pivot, and all the girls will wheel to the right, as the spokes of a wheel. The outer girls will have to take very long steps, in order to keep the shape of the wheel. See that the flags are all held in a straight line. Let the wheel revolve three times.
