The property was bought by Mr. Nesbitt, who was given an interim receipt, which calls for a deed to the property unless the owner redeems it within a year from the date of sale by paying all arrears and 10 per cent, interest on the purchase money. Mr. Ormerod bought this interim receipt from Mr. Nesbitt, and, as the owner did not redeem the land within a year, he now asks for the deed. The Council is said to have come into possession of the property by assuming that when the original owner neglected to pay the arrearages within a year after the sale the village had the right to pay the arrearages itself and take the property, so the municipality issued a deed of the land to itself and then proceeded to build upon it. What is claimed is, that the Council could not acquire the land before the year elapsed without the consent of the original owner, and that after the year elapsed, no one but the holder of the receipt of sale was entitled to it.
